This portion would complete the loop to allow residents in Prestwick, Lakeview Estates, Frankfort Meadows and Timbers Edge access to the Old Plank Road Trail.

Kansas City-based industrial warehouse developer, NorthPoint Development, has been working on a plan to acquire nearly 3,000 acres of prime farmland in our area and replace it with a massive industrial warehouse complex. This project is being proposed at a time when Will County is suffering from an astronomical growth in trucking and warehouse development that is straining an already decrepit and ill-maintained roadway system.

As a result many residents of this area are fed up with local, regional and state governments allowing this area to be turned into an unsafe and unlivable industrial zone. This proposed development would negatively impact our communities to the point that they would be unrecognizable if North-Point were to come through. Learn more about the project.

In response to the proposal for this industrial warehousing project, local residents joined together. The result is an unofficial grassroots effort led by concerned Will County residents who are united by the desire to stop NorthPoint Development's proposed Compass Business Park. Also, Plattville has given us permission to use Pletcher Park for the focal point of the routes and the refreshments that are provided to the participants. I have been told by Jim Lambert that the routes will be very similar to the ones that were used last year. I think they make very good use of the loops that are available to us.

We will also have a sign-up sheet available at the club meetings starting in March. Last year there were over 80 volunteers. The riders have always commented on the great hospitality we provide.

The ride this year will be starting at 6:30 AM due to a couple of items. The first is that the riders are already queuing up this early and the second is that we have not made people wait. We will not be selling tee shirts this year. The cost of the shirts has started to get too high. This will be revisited for the 2021 ride. Ice cream will be available to the riders when they are done. I also believe Brent is going to try a new item or two for our menu.

### JBC Ride Definitions / Rules / Etiquette

SG - Show & Go - ride leaders, and distances can be decided at the ride Ride contacts are to be called for information about the ride.

S - Social - Group stays together, rides at posted level, has ride leader. All riders should plan to arrive at any scheduled ride at least 10 minutes before the scheduled departure time.

### **AD HOC RIDES**

- 1. A non-calendar ride, via google groups email invite
- 2. 12 hour advance notice, e.g. Friday 8am ride invite sent by 8pm Thursday
- 3. Invite must include starting time, location and ride level (I-V)
- 4. Additional details about the ride can be shared too.
- 5. Miles are recorded as: AH/date/leader initials/miles/riders (in alpha form).
- 6. Use AD Hoc number assigned to the day of the ride
- 7. 2 riders minimum for instate rides and 3 riders minimum for out of state rides
